
We will be discussing the DVD series "God Is Closer than You Think" by John Ortberg during the teaching portion of the service.

Then on the 14th, we will begin the season of fasting and contemplation-Lent-with our Ash Wednesday observance. That evening, we *will* gather at 7:00 pm for worship and imposition of ashes.

On this most solemn and holy day, we are called to kneel before the altar and have blackened crosses of ash imprinted on our foreheads. You will hear the words, "Remember your mortality, and anticipate your eternity" spoken over you. The traditional saying with which most of us are familiar is, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," but I have changed the saying, because I want this moment to be dramatic and soulshaking. Returning to dust sounds finite. On Ash Wednesday, we are given a clear reminder that we are sinners in need of forgiveness. It is also meant as a reminder of the reality of our eternity, and that we each live, not only a mortal life on this earth, but an immortal life after our physical death, and that it is by God's sacrifice and grace alone that we are not condemned.

For me, Lent is the most significant season of the church year. It is a dark journey, void of alleluias, which leads me to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, to witness for myself the sacrifice and the pain that Christ endured, so that I might be reconciled with God. Then I will travel to the tomb on Easter morning to witness God's promise fulfilled in Christ's resurrection from the dead.

Jesus is raised on Easter morning to live forever, so that I may be raised to live forever, as well, in the love of God's eternal light. God is proven mightier than any power, even the power of death and the devil. I celebrate with great "Alleluias" on Easter morning, and proclaim, "CHRIST IS RISEN. HE IS RISEN INDEED! I need this time of contemplation and penitential prayer. It is my time to prepare for the party of Easter morning. I have said before, a party for its own sake can be fun, to be sure. But a party given for a reason and with a theme, a party for which I've prepared, is so much more understandable and enjoyable.

I invite you to join me on this deep, spiritual journey. Take time to consider what had to happen in order for us to have the gift of eternal life, and what our appropriate response of praise and thanks is.

As for our Wednesday evenings during Lent, we will gather for a light supper at 6:00 pm, followed by worship using the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy at 7:00 pm. For our teaching time, we will be watching a DVD series by Dr. John Ortberg titled "God Is Closer Than You Think." Each DVD presentation is approximately ten minutes long, followed by guided discussion that will allow everyone to participate.





IT'S BIRDIE TIME!!



Being the last day of the liturgical season historically known as Shrovetide, before the penitential season of Lent, related popular practices, such as indulging in food that one sacrifices for the upcoming forty days, are associated with Shrove Tuesday celebrations, before commencing the fasting and religious obligations associated with Lent. The term <u>Mardi Gras</u> is French for "Fat Tuesday", referring to the practice of the last night of eating richer, fatty foods before the ritual fasting of the Lenten season, which begins on Ash Wednesday.

Shrove Tuesday is observed by many Christians, including Anglicans, Lutherans, Methodists, and Roman Catholics, who, as they begin the Lenten Season, "make a special point of self-examination, of considering what wrongs they need to repent, and what amendments of life or areas of spiritual growth they especially need to ask God's help in dealing with."
