

We have island residents who are searching for a church family, and we have LOTS of annual visitors to the island. It is imperative that we let them know how happy we are that they are worshiping with us. Remember, the frequent visitor of today is the permanent resident of tomorrow, and when they move here, they'll join us in our mission.

I'm not into growth for the sake of growth. I'm into growth because that means more people will hear God's Word and receive the sacraments. More people will come into ministry, which feeds their souls and furthers our mission.

However, I am still a little concerned with how welcome we are making families with children feel. Children chirp! They get a little squirmy! What we must NEVER, EVER DO is show annoyance with the presence of youth in our worship service. In fact, we should make an extra effort to make them feel welcome. I realize we have "old school" Lutherans among us who were brought up in the church understanding that one must NEVER make a noise, or move, or look happy to be there. I believe more and more people are looking for a place where they can relax and feel safe, but still practice a Lutheran liturgy that honors God with reverence. That is how we will attract more people. Let the younger families, teenagers and kids know how happy you are that they are with us. Failure to do so is the kiss of death for a congregation.

Our Lenten journey continues. As part of our Lenten discipline, we gather on Wednesday at 6:00 pm for a light supper, followed by evening prayer at 7:00.

I hope you will join us for this important time of fellowship, worship, and learning.

CLC COUNCIL CORNER

Below is a brief recap of our most recent Christ Lutheran Council meeting which was held on Feb. 20, 2018.

Minutes from our January 16th meeting were approved.

- Staff and Ministry reports were reviewed and approved.
- Council considered and passed a recommendation from the Administrative & Finance Committee along with approval from the Personnel Committee which recommended a one-time performance adjustment of \$3,500 for the Parish Administrator and \$2,500 for the Music Director. Neither of these positions have received any additional compensation over the past two years despite outstanding performance. We felt it was appropriate to do so once we reviewed the surplus in funds that we were fortunate to have from 2017. We also wanted to include the Pastor in the as well, given that he has not had an increase since he has been here, but he declined to participate in this additional compensation at this time preferring that this be focused on the staff members.
- We reviewed the results of the Annual Congregational Meeting which was held on Feb 4, 2018. This included the passage of the 2018 Ministry Spending Plan, Continuing Resolution on the Endowment Fund and the ratification of our revised constitution as well as the establishment of a Renovation & Capital Fund Task Force. The Renovation & Capital Fund Task Force will hold it's first meeting on March 6, 2018.
- Council spent time discussing it's major priorities for 2018 and agreed to the following:
 - Review and evaluate the role and effectiveness of each Ministry Team -Acknowledge and encourage what is working well.
 - 2. Strengthen our Ministry Teams Focus on increasing the effectiveness and continuity of our Ministry Teams.
 - 3. Renovation and Capital Fund Improvement Project Designate and work with the newly formed task force as voted on by the Congregation.
- We spent significant time discussing Priorities # 1 & # 2 above in regard to our Ministry Teams, noting where we could support what is working well and where were our major opportunities to improve. A common tread through this discussion was how we could broaden participation of our members on these teams. We simply need more members involved.
- We discussed the need to establish safety procedures and policies for church volunteers so that we protect our volunteers from unsafe situations. The Personnel Ministry working with the Buildings & Maintenance Ministry will work together on this for review and approval by Council.
