



During worship, we will hear once again the parable of the Prodigal Son, from the Gospel of Luke. This is actually a great case study in decision-making that brings up several questions. Specifically, how often do we bring God into our decision-making process? For those of us who were not here Wednesday evening for Evening Prayer and the program, we spent time talking about this subject.

So, what might be some of the things we do that block God from being part of how we make decisions? Do any of these thoughts ever influence how you make choices?

- I prioritize: This is important. I want it more than anything else right now.
- I rationalize: What I want is so reasonable and normal, it would be practically unreasonable and abnormal not to have it.
- I romanticize: If I have this, I will feel happy and complete.
- I globalize: Everyone else has this, so I should have it, too.
- **I exceptionalize**: *I know I shouldn't have this (do this), but these are special circumstances.*

I've told you about the bumper sticker that was popular among the students when I was in seminary: WIGIAT. Again, it stands for <u>Where Is God In All This?</u>

Indeed, where is God in the decisions and choices we make, be they as mundane as prioritizing your list of chores and errands you have for today, or making the decision to retire and move? Is it "all about me," or are we asking God's guidance and will in all that we do? Just a few things to consider-*prayerfully*!



A volunteer will also monitor the parking lot at the beginning of each service to help direct traffic to open parking spaces.

To keep CLC members in the informational loop from the Deep Well Project, please note that food requests for February continued to be high (but not as high as January requests). 362 people (43%) of those were children) received food from the DW Pantry in February. Food donations, on top of a twice weekly Second Helpings deliveries, totaled over 1,000 pounds and came from various Marriott properties, grocery stores, and 5 churches (CLC being one of those churches).

Please continue to bring to church soaps, shampoos and various other hygiene items for the *Clean* as a Whistle goodie bags. Our youth will be assembling goodie bags to take to Deep Well.

According to the CDC, for American youth between the ages of 10 and 24, suicide is the third leading cause of death. More teenagers die of suicide than from cancer, heart disease, AIDS, birth defects, stroke, pneumonia, influenza, and chronic lung disease - combined.
