Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother,

To the saints and faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Colossae:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father.

In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit.

For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God.

May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."





## June – August...

This summer, our annual Social Ministry  
**Summer *Loose Change* Collection**  
will be dedicated to the  
**Back Pack Buddies Program.**

Back Pack Buddies of Hilton Head is an important mission for our church. Christ Lutheran Church is one of four packing sites that provide 30,000 meals to all three public elementary schools as well as 2,400 supplemental bags to the middle school and high school to address hunger issues for our youth. **Here at CLC, we have provided 2,838 bags of food this year to 87 students at Hilton Head Elementary.** This is almost 7,000 pounds of food, which we move, pack, move again and then distribute to the children, all done by 40 volunteers. Each bag contains two breakfasts and two lunches for the weekend.

***All of our food is purchased, and we are completely dependent on donations to fund our all-volunteer organization.  
Each bag costs \$5 per child per week.***

**Collection to date = \$593.97**  
*(approx. 108 bags of 3,000 financed to date)*

PLEASE consider bringing your loose change to *'feed'* the *basket* (not the alligator!) in the backpack. Let's keep chomping down on our need to finance 3,000+ bags of food this year. This will be in our outer narthex, June through August.
