Consecration Sunday is November 10!

On the 10th, we have the *Privilege of Sharing* our resources, our gifts, our energy, our time, and our vision with the whole church. This Stewardship season, we have used the stewardship letter of St. Paul to the church at Corinth. He was encouraging them to give to the collection he was taking up around the Mediterranean Sea to benefit the first-church in Jerusalem. He seeks to inspire the Corinthians with the stewardship witness of the church in Macedonia, which though they were experiencing great persecution and poverty themselves, begged Paul to allow them to participate in this church-wide collection. They begged for "the privilege of sharing."

In other words, while everyone would understand that they were in a difficult time themselves, while many would totally understand that it just wasn't a good time for them to be generous: they were insistent that they wanted to "put their whole selves in." Those who were in worship or who read the sermon from Reformation Sunday will recognize that Hokey Pokey reference.

Once a year, and then all year long, we are each challenged to put our whole selves in as members of the body of Christ. Each of us has to discern what that looks like for us. We each have things to offer. When I visit older adults who are homebound, I often encourage them to take the church directory and pray for each member. What a gift that would be to all of us!

When new members join the congregation, I always try to have their box of offering envelopes ready for them on the day they are baptized or affirm their baptism. One time, we were receiving a woman in her 20s. When I gave her the box of envelopes, she started jumping up and down. "This is so great," she said, "now I really feel a part!" For her, stewardship was a privilege and a joy. May it be so for all of us!





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Your Church Council met at a regularly scheduled meeting on October 15, 2019 at 6:30pm. The following summarizes conversations at the meeting.

- Council welcomed Interim Pastor Mary Anderson who joined Christ Lutheran on October 10.
 Pastor Mary, we are glad you're here!
- The Ad Hoc Committee is working on a comparison of three Lutheran denominations -Lutheran Churches in Ministry for Christ (LCMC), North American Lutheran Church (NALC) and Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA). The report is to be finished by November 15 and published to the congregation by November 30, 2019. A copy of the report

will be mailed to each household.

- Council decided to hold the next Town Hall meeting on Tuesday, December 10 at 6:00pm.
- At the regularly scheduled meeting on December 17, Council will determine next steps.
- Rita Hungate led a brief discussion on Security Preparedness and she will investigate a "Stop the Bleeding" class for Council, ushers and other members of our congregation.
- 2019 Year End Process discussion
 - Stewardship Campaign will begin on October 20.
 - Reminder to submit all 2020 expense requests to Wayne Sebulsky.
 - Council agreed to offer instructions in the Weekly Update for giving to various funds that support Christ Lutheran Church.
 - o Giving cards will be received during worship services on Sunday, November 10.
- There are 7 Council seats to fill for 2020, 2 open seats and 5 council members have agreed to stand for re-election. The Nominating Committee will include Rita Hungate, Chairperson, Jim Breland, John Babbitts and Marajeane Zodtner. Nominations are due by November 12.
- Joe Etter announced the Parish Administrator position has been filled. Linda Sheetz will join Christ Lutheran on November 18, 2019. Barbara Klatt will train Linda in her duties.
- Council reviewed priorities for 2019 2020 and agreed to focus on:
 - Renovation project
 - Inviting and Welcoming
 - Thoughtfully expanding our worship experiences
 - Outreach ministries
 - Christ Lutheran Preschool
