THE DIALOGUE IN ON -The Refugee Crisis

It's not news to anyone that we are living in a time of conflict, division, and disagreement.

In politics, in religion, in education, in relationships and communities and churches, we are becoming people who can't seem to find our way out of the "us vs. them"



pit of divisiveness. It doesn't matter who you think is "us" and who is "them." We are all stuck. And yet we know it doesn't have to be like this. In the face of cracking communities and strained family dynamics, **the church is uniquely equipped to bring healing, hope, and wholeness to a hurting world.** Ours is a faith built on hope, on the belief that we are all created in the image of God, on the assurance that no person or situation is beyond redemption. We believe faith is not only believing in God, but doing the work of God in the world. We are the shining city on a hill, and the world needs our light more than ever.

Join us for six SPIRITED CONVERSATIONS over pizza and salad in HEINRICHS HALL on Wednesdays at 6 pm, starting on January 15, 2020 until February 19, 2020. (Ash Wednesday in 2020 falls on February 26)

This winter we will learn about the ongoing refugee crisis. We will hear stories from refugees themselves and from the many organizations that walk alongside refugees as they build new lives. We will spend time talking to one another and sharing perspectives on the week's topic. We will have time to explore our ideas as a group, and time to process our ideas with small groups. And we will work together to create an action plan that fits our context.

LOCAL MISSION: DEEP WELL



CLC supports the Deep Well Project as an outreach arm of the church. Deep Well is a very important local social service organization, giving assistance to some of the neediest and most vulnerable local island residents. It was founded over 40 years ago by one of CLC's early members, Charlotte Heinrichs. It receives no governmental funding and over 90% of monetary donations goes to client services.

Over the holidays, the Deep Well Project served over 600 Hilton Head Island children with new toys and clothes. Many CLC members contributed to the Santa Shop, either through donations or through their time. Thank you! Deep Well served Christmas Dinners to 89 island families through the Pantry. Another 107 families were coordinated for other groups, totaling 196 island families got their Christmas Dinner through Deep Well services.
