Though the word *trinity* is not found in the scriptures, today's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:
This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

On this bread and wine, on this altar and in our homes, come, Holy Spirit: **Come**, **Holy Spirit**.

Manifest here the body and blood of Christ, come, Holy Spirit: **Come**, **Holy Spirit**.

On your people separated, yet still one in you, come Holy Spirit: **Come, Holy Spirit.**

On this earth, its waters and lands and skies, come, Holy Spirit: **Come**, **Holy Spirit**.

On plants and animals, and even on the stars, come, Holy Spirit:

Come, Holy Spirit.

We plead for your Spirit, to cry aloud in us, with us, and for us.

Breathe your life into our bones.

Anoint us for service with your oil of gladness.

Translate our speech into tongues of wisdom.

Shower on us your gifts:

love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

Sanctify the whole earth with your truth.

Bring us at the end with all your needy children into your homeland of mercy.

Once more we praise and worship and bless you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, God of supreme mercy and might, God of the cross and the empty tomb, God of the power of justice and peace, now and forever.
