When we gather for synod assembly each year, we always take up an offering during our big worship services. The offerings are designated for special projects

and each congregation's voting members are invited to bring their offering to put in the plate. This is different this year. We will have one worship service during our virtual assembly and an offering is being designated for the playground at Cristo Rey. The Church Council agreed to send an offering of \$500. The cost of the playground is about \$15,000. However, the children and youth at Cristo Rey have been doing fundraisers and have already raised about \$6,000 for it. CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

REPORT TO COUNCIL ON RESPONSES TO SPIRIT LED TIME OF RENEWAL

There were twenty-three responses submitted through July 15, 2020. This compares with fourteen responses during the last Call Committee in 2015. Many responses were singular in nature and would translate to the interview phase or submission to individual Ministry Teams for consideration. However, some major themes emerged due to their frequency of response and interconnection to other areas of importance. I will attempt to detail those themes in the following general categories:

- Pastor Mary as Interim Pastor
- Improvement in the Music Program, True Contemporary Service and Attraction of Younger, Diverse members
- The Embrace of Technology in the Church
- Continue Outreach Ministries in the Community

Pastor Mary as Interim Pastor

Pastor Mary's performance was the most frequent area of response. Her leadership, steady hand, energy and drive were continually complemented. Her ability to continue ministries, communication and continue worship services was mentioned in regard to dealing with adverse situation. Her ability to embrace technology was noted, as well, as a way to provide new avenues of worship. Her traits were mentioned as those needed in a new pastor for our church. In fact, the Call Committee has met with Pastor Mary to gage her perspective on the call process from a candidate's point of view. Her experiences as a candidate should prove valuable to the committee.

MUSIC PROGRAM-CONTEMPORARY SERVICE-YOUNGER FAMILIES

These three responses were often included together as a possible way as a method for a new pastor to update the worship service, use technology and contemporary music elements to attract younger families to the church.

Many responses centered on a true contemporary service at 8:30 including these elements. In addition, improvement in the music program was also mentioned in regard to the 10:30 service. The music program was the second most frequent response after Pastor Mary.

TECHNOLOGY

Some members expressed their desire to return to in-person church services as soon as possible. However, another sizable segment have enjoyed the flexibility provided by the use of technology. The ability to participate in services at different times and places have gained traction during the current situation. Our congregation is normally active in traveling and we have numerous associate members in other places, who can now ZOOM in.

CONTINUE OUTREACH MINISTRIES IN THE COMMUNITY

Our ministries are an important part of our connection to the community. The ministries have stayed active, maintained their volunteer base and have even expanded with the Thursday sandwich program. Responses indicated a strong desire to continue our ministries. In addition, the case was made to expand our role in the community and interconnect with other churches and community organizations in areas of mutual interest.

The Call Committee uses all this data to construct the Ministry Site Profile to use in marketing our church through the ELCA and the SC Synod. We also have to provide considerable community information in the process. We hope to complete the Call Process within a one year time period. Obtaining a new pastor, like a good marriage, requires a good match on both sides. Even when a match is made, salary, benefits, housing, schools for children, moving expenses and a possible house sale remain to be handled. All this occurs after we agree on direction, philosophy and all the other elements that define a successful pastor-church relationship. We need God's support and guiding hand to accomplish this critical goal.

Your Church Council met via Zoom for its regularly scheduled Council Meeting on July 21, 2020. Here are highlights from the meeting:

- Pastor Mary will be away for a two week vacation beginning Monday, July 27. Christ Lutheran is invited on August 2 to join the virtual Sunday service provided by St. John's Lutheran Church in Beaufort. You will receive further information on how to access that service.

- Council voted to approve a \$500 donation toward playground equipment for the new Cristo Rey congregation.
