# BUILDING A CULTURE OF GENEROSITY

#### **Growing in Generosity**

As you will learn from the video that we taped for presentation during today's Zoom worship service, the church will be mailing our 2021 Stewardship Campaign Statement of Intent letters to all of our church members, associates and friends tomorrow (Monday, October 26<sup>th</sup>). We are asking that your completed Statement of Intent cards be returned by next Sunday November 1<sup>st</sup> when all the cards that have been received will be dedicated during that Sunday's Zoom Worship service.

As you consider your giving to the church next year, think back on all of the stewardship videos that you have seen in October and all of the CLC Bridge Newsletter articles and bulletin inserts that you have read, and remember all of the Mission Impact stories that these videos and articles have shared. Then prayerfully consider how you might grow in generosity in 2021. If we all do our part, Christ Lutheran Church can grow its worship and faith formation opportunities and its support of its social ministries and outreach programs. There is much more that we can do together if we all grow in generosity! So how might we grow in generosity?

An idea for someone whose income has gone down in the last year:

Everyone can grow in generosity, even if that means the overall dollars given decreases. Perhaps, if before your income decreased you were giving away 2% of your income, now with income being less, can you find a way to grow the percentage of giving to say 2½% or 3%. So, while the total dollars amount might decrease your percentage of giving could still increase.

#### Other ideas:

- Systematic giving leads to generosity: For most people, we can grow significantly in our giving
  just by giving on a regular basis. Consider signing up for automatic giving or adding an amount
  each week or month. Growing giving by \$1 per day equates to significant growth over the
  course of the year.
- 2. Consider giving an extra gift or two during the year: During the current pandemic crisis, a story was shared about someone who said, "I'm not sure what the future holds for me, but for now I am doing okay, so I will double my giving during the current month". Well, what if we decided to double our giving one month or even two months next year?
- 3. Grow by a percentage each year: For some, the idea of a tithe is unachievable in a single year, but something people would like to reach someday. By growing giving by a percentage each year, it is achievable over the long-term. If you currently give away 2% of income, perhaps you can reach 2½% or 3% next year with a similar increase the year after. This takes discipline, but over the long-term is effective for some.

You may have your own ideas for growing in generosity. As a church family, as we each grow in our generosity, it will have a tremendous overall impact.

#### **Upcoming Commemorations**

#### James of Jerusalem, martyr, died around 62

#### Friday, October 23, 2020

One of three early-church leaders named James, this man is identified in the New Testament and by a historian of the time as a brother of Jesus. Scholars are uncertain whether this means a blood brother. He was a leader of the church in Jerusalem.

## Philipp Nicolai, died 1608; Johann Heermann, died 1647; Paul Gerhardt, died 1676; hymnwriters

#### Monday, October 26, 2020

These great hymnwriters all worked in seventeenth-century Germany in times of war and plague. Nicolai, a pastor, lost 1,300 parishioners to plague, 170 in one week. He wrote "O Morning Star, how fair and bright" and "Wake, awake, for night is flying." Heermann's hymns, including "Ah, holy Jesus," often express the emotions of faith. Gerhardt, perhaps the greatest Lutheran hymnwriter, was a pastor in Berlin.

#### Simon and Jude, Apostles

#### Wednesday, October 28, 2020

We know little about these apostles. Simon is listed as "the zealot" or Cananean in New Testament lists. Jude, also called Thaddeus, asked Jesus at the last supper why he had revealed himself to the disciples but not to the world.

#### **Reformation Day**

Saturday, October 31, 2020

By the end of the seventeenth century, many Lutheran churches celebrated a festival commemorating Martin Luther's posting of the Ninety-five Theses, a summary of abuses in the church of his time. At the heart of the reform movement was the gospel, the good news that it is by grace through faith that we are justified and set free.
