From Pastor Mary

Dear Church:

Thank you for your many well-wishes as I travel for my daughter Colleen's wedding in North Carolina this weekend. Colleen is our oldest child and has lived in the Hickory, NC area since 1999 when she went there to attend Lenoir-Rhyne University. She is a



registered nurse and currently works at Trinity Lutheran Nursing Home in Hickory. Her campus pastor from LR University is presiding at the wedding. The wedding is taking place at the Old Henry River Mill that is currently being restored by a friend of Colleen's to be a venue for gatherings and as a place to teach about the lives of mill families. Those who are familiar with *The Hunger Games* movies may recognize it as "District 12" where Katniss and Peeta lived. So yes, my millennial daughters are very excited about that! I'll share pictures.

I'm also very excited to report that the grant request for \$3,000 we sent to the SC Synod Growing in God's Mission Fund to help support our efforts in Beaufort County to provide internet and other technology needs to students in need, was received in full! With this grant and with the money we raised as a congregation, the ELCA Lutherans on HHI have provided \$8,412.00 to this effort. All public high school students now have internet access and teachers now have 88 cameras that they needed to teach via zoom. The Education Subcommittee of the MLK Committee for Justice is meeting with the superintendent of Beaufort Country Schools next week to deepen our partnership.

We have many plans and transitions going on at CLC right now. This can be both exciting and unsettling. This issue of The Bridge gives you much information about these plans. Thank you for reading about them all. Thank you for doing your part to partner with each other. Look for more letters from the church next week to inform you of other important matters. Please, turn in your pledge card. Sign up for an opportunity to meet our pastoral candidate. Put the upcoming Advent opportunities on your family calendar. MIDWEEK ADVENT VESPERS

"Vespers" are sunset evening prayer services that we will hold outside in our grassy parking area beginning at 5pm on Wednesdays December 2, 9 and 16 and on Monday December 21.

We plan to have the sound system set up, live music, handbells, and an evening service of about 30 minutes. We'll have some lights in the trees and torches serving as the four candles of Advent. The campfire will be burning. Those who want to depart at the end of the service are welcome to do so. Those who want to stay under the stars and around the fire are welcome to linger and toast a marshmallow or two. (Bring your own skewer. The church will provide the marshmallows.)

Worshipers are asked to bring: a beach chair, a mask, a small flashlight or the light on your phone. We may send you an order of service that can be utilized on your phone as well as having a few paper copies.

Information for Outdoor Worship

It is very important to know and take personal notice of several health-conscious points regarding these worship services:

For the Safe-Keeping and Love of Your Neighbor:

- 1. This opportunity for gathering in-person, even though outdoors, is not a COVID risk-free environment.
- 2. Anyone not feeling healthy, and/or vulnerable to COVID infection as outlined by the CDC, and/or not wanting to risk gathering within a crowd, should not attend.
- 3. The wearing of a face mask over both the mouth and nose will be required at all times for all persons over the age of 3 years old. Please bring your own mask. Should anyone forget, we will have a limited number of clean masks available.
- 4. In addition to wearing a mask, maintaining a social distance of no less than 6 feet between family units will also need to be honored. Though we do deeply miss you, all church staff will be maintaining strict social distance around themselves and will be wearing a mask.
- 5. Anyone over the age of 3 years old not willing/able to keep a face mask over both their mouth and nose, or maintain these social distancing stipulations, should not attend.

Logistics Regarding this Outdoor Worship Service:

- 1. When possible, the worship service will be recorded posted to the church website, just as we have done in previous months.
- 2. Worship service will take place in the side yard southwest of the Sale (office) building.
- 3. Each person will need to bring their own chair to sit on.
- 4. The ability to see and hear may be an issue for some attendees. We will try to do the best we can in ways that we can safely manage. Please consider your hearing/seeing abilities when making your space selection among those available.
- 5. Access to the inside of the church building (including the restrooms) will be restricted to urgent needs only. A staff member will be available to help when needed.
- 6. Skin protection and personal hydration (bring your own water) are recommended. In the event of inclement weather, worship will be done via our media. We will try to communicate that decision to you with as much advanced notice as possible.

The Worship of Our Lord:

- 1. We will have a shortened service to minimize exposure time (around 30 to 45 minutes).
- 2. Offering plates will not be passed. Online giving (or the church mailbox) remain available for our offerings to God.
- 3. Worship leaders will explain about music and invited congregational response at each opportunity.

UPDATE FOR ADOPT-A-CHILD FUNDRAISER

The Community Foundation of the Lowcountry makes \$54,784 grant to support local education.

Through the fundraising efforts of the Student Tech Fund and many donors (including CLC), the Community Foundation of the Lowcountry was able to provide a grant of \$54,784 to the

Beaufort County School District. The Student Tech Connect Fund worked with Hargray and BSCD to provide internet connections to high school students in low income households with no Wi-Fi. In addition, funding was provided for:

- The purchase of 88 cameras for HHHS teachers
- The purchase of a Creative Curriculum Digital curriculum for 64 pre-K and early childhood special education classrooms.

Jackie Rosswrum, the interim president and CEO of the Community Foundation stated: "We realized that, though food and housing insecurity continues to be a hardship for many, the start of the school year has created some unique educational challenges. Parents with the financial need to

continue working need help ensuring their children are getting online instruction. Local non-profit organizations have stepped up to create virtual learning hubs or to provide safe and clean locations where children can get instruction."

HANDBELL NEWS!


