In our Lenten Vespers on Wednesday, we discussed all the things that the pandemic had taken away from us. People mentioned visiting family and friends, traveling, concerts, sporting events, worshipping together, singing together, and just living without fear of catching a deadly disease. And some people have lost loved ones, and even their own lives. Over 500,000 Americans have died. That is an enormous amount of people. Most of us know someone who has died from COVID or know someone who has lost someone to COVID. Even as we have adjusted to all these realities, it is important to acknowledge that we have lost so much in the past year.



With the vaccines coming out and disease numbers slowly coming down, we are all anxious to get back to those things we can get back to and put this year behind us. But now, while we are still needing to be cautious, we should take the time to take stock of our losses. Grief has a way of coming back to us if we don't acknowledge it and work through it. We don't have to dwell on it constantly and continually feel sorry for ourselves, but we just need to accept it and feel it. Many people think of Lent just as a time of repentance for our sins. But it can also be a time of reflection. Taking acknowledge our vulnerability. This Lent (a year into our new reality) let us all take the time to process this pandemic and mourn our losses. Lent can be a time of mourning, a time of dying with Christ in order to rise again.




Another opportunity to help the Preschool will happen on Friday, March 19th.

SECURITY OF THE BUILDINGS

With more people accessing our various buildings the question of office security has arisen. We have had security issues in the past, so we would like to make everyone aware and re-institute some locking procedures.

People who use the craft room and Sunday school rooms can access the Sale building without going through the office. The key in the lock box across from the door to Heinrichs Hall also opens the side door to the Sale building. The two interior and one exterior door to the office area use a special key that is marked "do not duplicate". It has been issued to only a few people while many people know how to access the lock box.

Recently the interior doors to the office area have not been locked after office hours. Please make sure that the two interior and one exterior door to the office area are locked when no one is in the office. In the past those doors have also been locked during office hours and this would be additional security requiring anyone who needs access to the office to come through the front door where they can be screened. You can access the Sale building without going through the office.

Also, Heinrich's Hall has been left unlocked and all the lights left on after hours. Please make sure you lock all the doors behind you and turn the lights off when you leave the property.
