This week (Friday the 13 th 2020!) marks one year since the pandemic lock downs, restrictions, and cancellations started to happen all over the world. Remember those insane days? The fear and confusion? The anxiety about



the future? All of the unknowns? All the computer programs we had to learn immediately? I had a lot of sleepless nights wondering if it was the end of the world – or at least the end of the church and everything I knew. During those sleepless nights, I wondered what God was up to and where was all of this going.

In the last year, so many people have died and become terribly sick because of COVID. But many of us are living through it, and are surviving, and are even looking toward to the future. Wednesday we continued our Lenten Vespers and our discussion of the pandemic. The question we discussed this time was "How do you see God at work in the pandemic?" Now I do not think that God makes things like pandemics, or wars, or famines, or natural disasters. I do not think that God causes suffering. But I do believe that God is always using these things to change us, to challenge us, and to move us, however incrementally, towards God's vision for all creation.

Many people mentioned the generosity they have seen from people in our community and around the world was a sign of God's work. Another mentioned the positive environmental impact was God's work. Others said that their fear of getting COVID this past year has given us a new sense of compassion for those who always live in fear – because of their skin color, or their economic

situation, or their sexual identity. And others mentioned that they saw God in the need we have to help people in other countries get vaccinated and recover from the pandemic (if the everyone around the world doesn't get vaccinated the pandemic might never end!) All of these examples (and more) are certainly signs of God moving us towards God's vision. We are all part of God's work!

We see God in all things, not just in worship on Sunday, or in our devotional life, but in all times and places. God is at work, Christ is at work, the Holy Spirit is renewing us and moving us all the time. My hope this Lent is that we don't forget these lessons we are learning during this difficult time. That we let the Spirit work in and through us to change the world!

COVID Update from Bishop Ginny Aebischer

Dear South Carolina Leaders,

We recognize that across the South Carolina Synod our congregations have experimented with and participated in a variety of worship gathering practices throughout this pandemic that have been highly contextual. Our main concern and recommendation is that while congregational leaders seek to offer the proclamation of the gospel and the opportunity to worship they also follow best practices for keeping everyone in their communities as safe as possible.



As we come to what we hope will be our homestretch in this pandemic that we pray everyone will remain patient, calm and considerate of one another. We have all come a long way in the last year by simplifying our lifestyles and simply staying home. While the vaccine and the warming weather brings us all hope for gathering in-person once again as soon as possible, we still need to be mindful of the need for truly safe practices. It is important to remember that even if you have been able to get your vaccine, someone in your faith community is still be waiting. Time is still needed for more members of our communities to have access to the vaccines and to let those vaccines take full effect. Please show continued care and respect for all our neighbors and give everyone time to allow this to work.

The DHEC website indicates that we are now in Phase 1b for the vaccine and we understand that this includes front line workers of any age, and further, that pastors, deacons and church staff members are included. Please check the SCDHEC.gov website for more details and information about how to make an appointment for your vaccine.

We continue to recommend that online, or outdoor gathering, physically distanced and with face masks be your first choice for worship options. Indoor gatherings should continue to be limited in numbers with good physical distancing and the use of face masks. Holy Communion may be celebrated following appropriate protocols. Please keep a record of all in attendance at any in-person gathering in the event that contact tracing needs to be done. Indoor worship should not include congregational singing yet. Outdoors, singing may be permitted at significant, safe distance and wearing face masks. We do not recommend hosting any coffee hours or fellowship meals yet. We highly recommend that everyone who can, get a vaccine when it is made available to you. Continuing to follow these safety guidelines now can mean that we are all able to gather more fully in the near future.

We remember those we have lost during this pandemic and to hold in prayer all those sisters and brothers

who grieve. We also give thanks for all the faithful partners in our communities that are bringing us through this pandemic: the healthcare workers, the teachers and school administrators, the farmers, the truck drivers and grocery store workers, the parents, the pastors, deacons, musicians, and all the tech folks who have made our online gatherings possible. God has shown us that we are people who can persevere, who can innovate, who can be creative and amazing neighbors to one another. Let us continue to pray for everyone in our communities and work together to continue lifting one another up as we all look forward to the day when we can all gather together safely and sing from the top of our lungs our praises to our Lord and Savior, Jesus, in whose name we gather.

News about our Little Free Pantry

Thank you everyone for your donations to last week's drive by collection for Deep Well, Thursday Lunch Break, the Preschool and the Little Free Pantry. The Service Team appreciates your consideration and donations!

As stated earlier, the LFP was unable to secure additional funding from the Community Foundation of the Lowcountry for 2021; all the distributed money from the COVID-19 Relief Fund went to well deserving organizations in Jasper and Hampton countries. Nothing was distributed to Hilton Head Island organizations. In order for us to continue to stock our pantry shelves we are looking into other revenue streams and asking our congregation members to continue to support our outreach to the food insecure adults and children here on the island. Please use the following list of on-going needed items when you go shopping. Throw some of these items in your cart and bring them to the blue wagon in the office. Another way to help is to offer monetary donations to the LFP; the donations go into a specific church account for the LFP. We'll shop for you! And finally for the Thrivent members among the congregation, you can make a simple application for a \$250 gift card from Thrivent and give it to a Service Team member (Leslie Heavener is the chair) so it can be used to buy items for the LFP.
