HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

Palm Sunday, March 28

We remember Jesus triumphal entry into Jerusalem and we read the passion story.

We will be worshipping in-person for the first time this year. It will be outside in the back parking area next to the Pre-School. There will be handicapped parking near the worship area. Bring your chair and wear a mask! We will be sharing communion (pre-packaged). There will be live music and Palms!

Maundy Thursday, April 1

Jesus last supper with his friends. We will remember how he washed the disciples feet, we will share communion, and strip the altar to prepare for Good Friday.

Noon – 1pm – Pr. June will give out communion outside in the front of the offices under the portico.

Good Friday, April 2

Remembering Jesus last day and his crucifixion. We will hear the passion story and pray for forgiveness.

Easter Sunday, April 4

We will celebrate Christ's resurrection and his victory over death! Together!

Changed

Listen, I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but we will all be changed . . . 1 Corinthians 15:52

This Wednesday in our Vespers service, we asked "how has the pandemic changed you?"

Some people see change as a fault. When someone says "You've changed" we can see it as an insult. We respond, "I haven't changed. I'm just the same as I've always been." It almost seems like a sign of weakness. We don't want to think that we were ever wrong or at fault or different. But we should take it as a compliment! We should change. I hope I'm not the same as I was at 10 years old, or as 20, or even the same as I was at 40 or even six months ago! We should be happy to have changed and to be changed by the events of our lives and the world around us, and ultimately by God.

God wants us to change. God wants transformation, growth, resurrection, new life. And the strange time we are living through will change us. We might not know all the ways it will change us as a country, as individuals, and as the church, but it will change us. Our hope is that this time will form us into God's vision for us: Not more anxious, but more hopeful. Not more bitter, but more loving. Not more stingy, but more generous.

This Lent, allow yourself to be changed by God's word, Christ's love, and the presence of the Holy Spirit!

News about our Little Free Pantry

Thank you everyone for your donations to last week's drive by collection for Deep Well, Thursday Lunch Break, the Preschool and the Little Free Pantry. The Service Team appreciates your consideration and donations!

As stated earlier, the LFP was unable to secure additional funding from the Community Foundation of the Lowcountry for 2021; all the distributed money from the COVID-19 Relief Fund went to well deserving organizations in Jasper and Hampton countries. Nothing was distributed to Hilton Head Island organizations. In order for us to continue to stock our pantry shelves we are looking into other revenue streams and asking our congregation members to continue to support our outreach to the food insecure adults and children here on the island. Please use the following list of on-going needed items when you go shopping. Throw some of these items in your cart and bring them to the blue wagon in the office. Another way to help is to offer monetary donations to the LFP; the donations go into a specific church account for the LFP. We'll shop for you! And finally for the Thrivent members among the congregation, you can make a simple application for a \$250 gift card from Thrivent and give it to a Service Team member (Leslie Heavener is the chair) so it can be used to buy items for the LFP. Bonnie Sikes has offered her assistance in filling out the application.
