Communion

There's currently a controversy going on in the Catholic Church going on about whether the bishops should recommend that priests should not give communion to the president and other politicians who openly support a woman's right to choose whether to have an abortion.

This will not be an article about abortion. There are many different opinions on that and the Catholic Church has chosen their stance on it. But this is an article about Communion, something that both denominations share, and have some similar views on, but also have many different views on. I cannot speak with any authority on Catholic Eucharistic theology, I'm sure they have their reasons for making the choices they will, but I can speak on the Lutheran understanding of the Eucharist. And this is a good opportunity to share my thoughts on this topic!

We believe in the Lutheran church that the Eucharistic table is not our table, it's Christ's table and that he is the host of our meal. Jesus ate with all kinds of people: his friends and apostles, yes; but also sinners, religious leaders who opposed him, and Zacchaeus the crooked tax collector (well, he invited himself to Zacchaeus' house), and also Judas, the one who would betray Jesus into the hands of those who crucified him. I don't believe we have the right to limit the table more than Jesus did to his own table.

We do not believe that the Eucharist is a reward for good behavior. It's not a prize for agreeing with everything that any church teaches (surely no one would be able to receive it if that were the case). It is Christ's body and blood, shed to take away the sins of the world. We believe it has the power to both convict and to heal. Martin Luther said in the Large Catechism, "Even though a scoundrel receives or administers the sacrament, it is the true sacrament . . . just as truly a when one uses it most worthily. For it is not founded on human holiness but on the Word of God." We believe that the Eucharist, and the worship surrounding it, has the power to heal and to change hearts and lives. We want people to receive this mysterious gift and to have their hearts and lives changed. I sincerely believe the more who receive it, the better.

Pastors and priests alike have given this sacrament to convicted murders and worse. There would have to be very good reason (that I have not come across yet) to deny someone Communion. The sacraments of Jesus should not be used as political tools or as a punishment for bad behavior. To do that cheapens the mystery that is Christ' body and blood broken and shed for us. We are all unworthy of this wonderful gift and mystery. We all come before Christ as sinner, repentant and unrepentant alike, and Christ still gives his whole life, broken and shed, for each of us. I believe that everyone is welcome to Christ's table.
