Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. 1 Corinthians:10

I think a lot of people who don't go to church imagine that everyone in the church works together in harmony and peace (or that's how it should be anyway). People who have been actually been part of a church know that is not always the case. I mean, we might get there at times, but most

churches have had many instances in their history where things were not peaceful or harmonious. This has been true since the beginning of churches. Just read some of Paul's letters (especially 1 and 2 Corinthians). In most of them he alludes to some sort of conflict or controversy in the churches that he founded. Every church that I've been a part of has had some kind of conflict in its past that has resulted in a loss of members and friendships. I suspect a majority of churches in the US have. And Christ Lutheran has had its share of conflict in its past.

In any group of people, there will be disagreements. We don't agree on how things should work, the process of things, the priorities, the way money is spent, the color of the drapes, any number of things. Disagreements happen all the time. They are nothing to be ashamed of or afraid of. We shouldn't avoid disagreements. And when we can work together on resolving disagreements, it can strengthen our relationships and help us grow together. But the problem comes when disagreements become conflicts.

Sometimes we use the terms "disagreements" and "conflicts" interchangeably. But there is a difference. Disagreements are when we have a difference of opinion and we can negotiate a resolution. We can usually come out with our relationships in tact. If not, we might "agree to disagree" if that's possible. Or we might avoid that topic in the future. But in conflicts we make negative assumptions about the motivations of the other person or people. We dig in our heels and refuse to compromise. In conflicts we often bring other people into our arguments and make people choose sides. Then our direct communication with the other parties stops. Sometimes we can even vilify the other people and believe they are awful, bad, or (in the church) "not Godly people". Disagreements can be controlled, but conflicts are hard to control. And the bigger a conflict is, the harder it is to get it under control. We've all probably be a part or, a witness, to conflicts that can't be controlled and how destructive they can be.

We should not be worried about getting into disagreements, when we're making bold and exciting choices and moving forward, that will happen! Some say we can't move forward and avoid disagreements. And healthy disagreements can actually make us a stronger congregation. On the other hand, we should try to avoid conflict. Fortunately, Jesus actually gave us many tools in the scriptures to help us not end up in conflict.

Next week, I'll talk more about the things that can lead to conflict and how we can avoid them.

The **SERVICE MINISTRY** team works beyond the walls of Christ Lutheran by reaching out to help others in our local community and beyond. The list of those we help includes **Backpack Buddies**, weekend meal assistance for underserved students, and the **Neighborhood Outreach Connection**, a bagged meal for 50 children in an after school outreach program. We also host a **Lunch Break** "soup kitchen" here at church every Thursday where we serve bagged lunches to many hungry folks. Our **Little Free Pantry**, located in the CLC parking lot, helps people with food insecurities 24/7. It is stocked daily with food, paper products and toiletries. We collect specified items, food, paper, and toiletries monthly for the **Deep Well Project**, an important local social service organization. Twice a year we host **Family Promise** of Beaufort County, a nationwide organization that houses homeless families and helps them to get back on their feet and regain their independence. This year we have partnered with **Habitat for Humanity**, Thrivent and nine other area churches to build a home for a local family in need of safe, affordable housing. Globally we have collected money and made baby quilts for a crisis nursery in **Malawi**.

Our team is always open to new members and new ideas for ways to serve others. We meet on the second Tuesday of every month at noon in Heinrich's Hall.

Helping one person might not change the world, but it might change the world for one person.
