In the mean time, we will be ZOOMing the worship this week. (You can use the normal ZOOM link which is listed above.) The technology for ZOOMing in the sanctuary is not the best, especially when it comes to the sound of the music, but we are just using this as a stop-gap until we can get the new system up and running.

When we do get the new system going with the streaming, it will be so much better than ZOOM! The sound will be coming through the sound system, the cameras will be crystal clear, there will be close ups, and people at home will be able to see the music on the screen. It will almost look like a professional production! It will be levels above what we have now.

We just need a little more patience until everything comes together!



Children in Church

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs."

Matthew 19:14

I think it's great have children in church. They add innocence, joy, laughter, creativity and unpredictability. A lot of you remember when your children were young and how Sunday worship was a family affair. Teaching children about God helps us to understand God ourselves. We help children to grow in faith and children help us to grow in faith. And, besides, I've been told I am pretty good at children's sermons too!

Lots of churches are in a position like ours where there are very few children in our church and the children we do have are growing up and are already in high school, or college, or moved to another area completely. There may be many reasons why this has happened. We might be sad about it, but there's no shame in it, and there are some things we can do to correct that reality.

Almost every church looking for a pastor these days says that a priority for them to "attract young families". Congregations are hoping that our churches will be passed on into future generations and having young people and children as a part of the membership is certainly a way to see that that happens.

But as much as older church goers would like to see children and young families in church in theory, many people have issues with children being in church in reality. Children can be noisy, restless, and even messy. They can sometimes create some interruptions. This is a reality of childhood. This is a reality of having children in our presence. This is not the problem.

The problem comes, in my experience, when the adults in church act annoyed. I have

seen people stare at families, ignore or avoid them after church, and I've actually heard some people in previous churches say to parents: "You should control your child better." and "My children never behaved like that in church." and "Children are supposed to be in the nursery". This kind of behavior can be extremely unwelcoming for children and especially for parents who are trying out a church for the first time and may already feel uncomfortable. To be honest, it's poison to new members of any age or family status.

Pastors cannot attract children and families to the congregation by themselves. The congregation they are in helps to make families feel comfortable and valuable. Families have to feel like their whole family is welcomed for them to decide to return. And we shouldn't just tolerate children. We should make a special effort to say "hello!", ask parents about their children, wave to the children, tell them your name and that you're glad they're here. It takes a lot of courage for a family to come to church for the first time. Let's all make sure that all people, young and old, know that they are truly welcome!

If you've been in the sanctuary, there is one pew missing from the back of the right hand side. I requested that especially so that parents could sit in the back row and children could use the space in front of it. We will eventually have quiet things in that space for children to play with and express themselves. My hope is that in the future, families will be worshipping with us, that children will grow up with the experience of worship and that they will love the Christian community, Jesus's teaching, and will know of God's love for them. And it all starts with them (and everyone else) feeling welcomed by everyone in worship!

Please sign up for September 5th! The memorial/honorarium will be posted in the Sunday bulletin weekly.


COVID UPDATE

The COVID numbers for Hilton Head and Beaufort County are trending lower and may be plateauing but our risk level is still severe. Sadly, the number of people hospitalized with COVID and needing ICU care is rising. As of 8/25/21, the percentage of ICU beds used for COVID patients is 89% with 16 patients in the ICU and 74 patients hospitalized overall. This is the highest these numbers have been. Thankfully more people are getting vaccinated: the percentage of people who are fully vaccinated is up to 46% while the percentage of people who have had at least one vaccination is 57%. This is good news but there is still a long way to go, so please encourage anyone you know who is not vaccinated to please do so. You can find locations to get the vaccine by going to https://vaxlocator.dhec.sc.gov/.

Here are CLC we will continue to follow the CDC Guidelines recommending all people, regardless of their vaccination status, wear a mask whenever they are indoors in public. Please also consider practicing social distancing (except for your immediate family) when you attend in-person worship.

As always, if you are experiencing any COVID symptoms, please stay home to keep your fellow congregation members safe.

Early Response Team (ERT) Training

St. Andrew-by-the Sea Methodist Church is offering ERT training.

An Early Response Team (ERT) is a self-contained team that enters a disaster area by invitation. ERTs provide emergency repairs and/or assistance to help people be safe, sanitary and secure until insurance and other help is available.

Teams fill a specific need in the early days after a disaster to clean out flood-damaged homes, remove debris, place tarps on homes, and otherwise help to prevent further damage, while providing a caring Christian presence. They are trained to provide various types of physical, emotional and spiritual assistance to disaster survivors. Training includes the basics of disaster response, how to work effectively with survivors and the response team, and skills to help survivors get back into their homes and begin the recovery process.

The training is Wednesday, October 20, 2021 9:00 am - 4:30 pm and it's \$35 per person which includes: lunch, T-shirt, credentials, background check, manual, and training.
