It's hard to believe, but I've been here in Hilton Head for almost a year now. And one thing that I'm pleasantly surprised about is how diverse it is. There are many communities of people of different races. I didn't expect that, and I am happy to see it. That being said, like other places, there is a divide between people of different races here. There is a divide of income and privilege and interactions. People of different races don't revolve in the same social

circles. We might interact with people of other races through their work or through our work, but there isn't much personal social interaction between people of different races. This is not unique to Hilton Head, of course, but I think the divisions are a more starkly defined here. And because we don't share social interactions, we don't hear a lot of stories or experiences from people of other races or economic situations. It's much easier to dismiss and ignore people when we don't know them personally.

At the end of April, we will be hosting a Diversity Weekend at Christ Lutheran that aims to aid in those personal interactions. On Saturday, April 30th, there will be a day of courageous conversation, a symposium, that will discuss our racial divide and the possibility of unity. There will be speakers and local government officials who will speak, and then people will meet around tables to have respectful conversations and share our experiences together. We will hear each other's stories and experiences, and help us to be better friends with each other across racial and economic divides. On April 29th and May 1 st, the Friday before the symposium and the Sunday after, there will be concerts showcasing the diversity of Hilton Head and the surrounding Lowcountry through music. It will be a concert of Gullah, Gospel, Latino, Lowcountry, and American Standard music. It will be directed by Terry Herron, who is the visionary behind the whole weekend.

This had been in the works to happen at Christ Lutheran in 2020, but it was stopped because of COVID. But we're happy to be hosting it again, and I'm happy to be involved in its planning. I'm also pleased that the proceeds from our first Christkindl Market this Sunday will be going to support the Diversity Weekend! This is important work that is being done and it is exciting that this congregation is supporting it.

Work like this is what the gospel of Jesus calls us to: To love people, understand people, and reconcile with people – especially those who are different from us. This is a vision of God's Kingdom. We can't just wish for it and pray for it, we are called to do something and this is a wonderful first step towards God's vision for us. Martin Luther King called it "the beloved community". The community that transforms those who are bitter towards one another, or who are indifferent to one another, into friends.

Come to support the Christkindl Market from 4-7pm on Sunday. Buy crafts, food, and gluhwein and know you are supporting a great thing: the Diversity Weekend, and God's vision for us on Hilton Head!

COVID UPDATE:

The COVID risk level remains at "Medium" for Hilton Head and Beaufort County. Currently, the infection rate is .87%, the positive test percentage is 3.3%, and the number of people hospitalized with COVID is 7, with 4 of those needing ICU care. It is still important to encourage anyone you know who is not vaccinated to please do so, especially with the potential for the new variant, Omicron, to show up across the US. It is just as important to get the 3rd vaccination for the same reason. You can find locations to get the vaccine by going to https://vaxlocator.dhec.sc.gov/. We continue to follow the CDC Guidelines recommending all people, regardless of their vaccination status, wear a mask whenever they are indoors in public. Please practice social distancing (except for your immediate family) when you attend in-person worship. As always, if you are experiencing any COVID symptoms, please stay home to keep your fellow congregation members safe.

plan is to deliver the available flowers to them!


We have two requests:
