Many hands lightened the load of work accomplished in the **Prayer Garden on Saturday**, **January 13**. I want to thank Susie Fidler, Joyce Prange, Marajeane Zodtner, Karen and Eric Momberger, Rick Klotz, Julie Raino, Merle Walker, Steve Mork, Laurie and Gary Fons, Bob Abdou, Mike and Patti Conklin and Pastor June for bringing tools, muscles, and enthusiasm to the outside areas of the church we often forget, particularly the Prayer Garden.

What might have taken several workdays to complete, all the pine straw in the Prayer Garden and the area outside the "breezeway" hallway to Heinrichs Hall was pulled away and carted off to several other sites on our campus needing pine straw. The bushes in the "breezeway" area have been trimmed back significantly. We created a huge pile of debris for Simon Landscaping to haul away for us. We even cleaned up the area behind the Sanctuary where no one ever goes!

The Prayer Garden Refurbishment Team can now move to planning paver areas in this space and contracting for further tree trimming and removal. Please take time to venture out to these areas and visualize what a calming space we hope to create in memory of the loved ones interred there.
