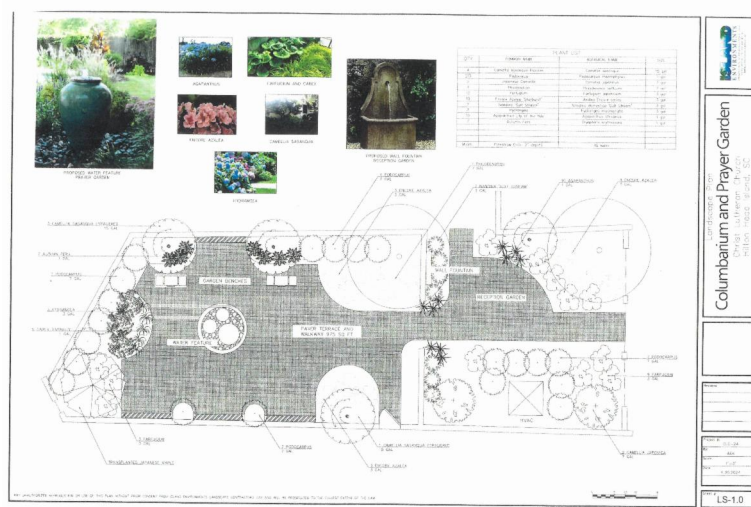

AGING MATTERS - FINDING YOUR CALLING FOR THE REST OF YOUR LIFE

Vocational discernment, says R. Paul Stevens, is a lifelong process — one that takes on even more significance in later life. In his book Stevens argues that our calling does not end with formal retirement; to the contrary, we do well to keep on working, if possible, till life's end since retirement in the sense of stopping work is not a biblical idea.

Retirement can be seen as a time of continued calling and productivity and biblical wisdom can help us redefine aging as an extraordinarily fruitful season of life.

We will explore matters of calling, spirituality, and legacy in retirement, showing that we must continue to discern our vocation as we grow older in order to remain meaningfully engaged for the rest of our lives.

We are made to work, work is good for us, it is a practical way of loving our neighbor, it participates in spreading the kingdom of God, it is the main context in which we grow spiritually, and it prepares us for the life to come.

Join us in our exploration of our God given talents and passions and what God expects us to do with them for the rest of our lives!

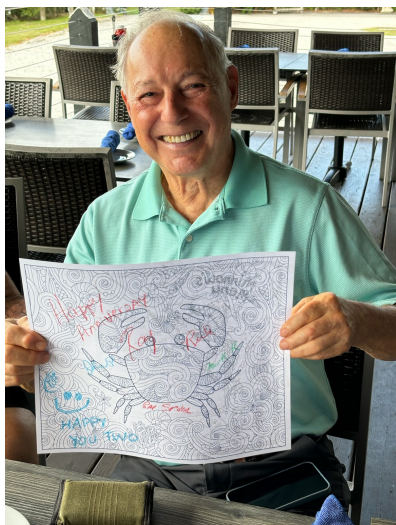


September CLC Book Club
